Vocational Training Program

Tech Mahindra Foundation Plus

NSIC Training Project Vocational

Deaf Enabled Foundation had established three centres for computer training with the great support by National Small Industries Corporation Limited at Puducherry, Thanjavur and Trichy. NSIC Corporate Social Responsibility has been encouraging us financial expenses for above three centres. We have been receiving a very good positive response from Deaf students as they have been benefitted to gain the Knowledge. The course provided to deaf students is known as "Foundation Course" which includes English structural grammatical course, Basic computer operating and general skills. The duration of this course is 45 days. We are very thankful to u for giving us wonderfully support.

DEF-VTP

The activities under the DEF- VTP are providing courses such as General English, Quality Computer Education, Vocational, Placement Services, Practical Life Skill Training and Indian Sign Language.

- ✓ The Foundation course includes English, MS Office, and Soft Skills, Typing Speed, Graphic Design. The duration of the course is 6 or 4 months.
- ✓ The Indian Sign Language course is trained on the basis hour's package.

Coaching Centre

Deaf students need additional help in Sign Language so they can understand and perform well in the courses they undertake. Keeping this in mind DEF started Coaching Classes forstudents whom want to do higher studies after S.S.C. The various courses like the Board of

Intermediate Education for Higher Education students, Andhra University and Anna malai University. A trained and experienced teacher teaches them with sign language that these students to complete their course with a good grade.


He gives most of the credit of his success to his parents and trainer who always remained very supportive of his dreams and helped his every step of the way.
