In the Indian Census of 2001, 1,261,722 persons were listed as hearing disabled among the totals of 21,906,769 populations of disabled in India. Another study states that more than 25,000 children are born deaf in India every year and eight-ten percent of the adult population has hearing problems.

Vocational Training Program

Tech Mahindra Foundation Plus

Deaf Enabled Foundation and Tech Mahindra Foundation both are going hand in hand successfully for 5 years. We have been receiving tremendous response from deaf students from all over India. This course is offered for 2 months. We could see self-confidence and development in all the students after completion of 2 months training. Today our students have been working with different companies like Ananth Technologies, Amaze Info Tech, Ducere, Deepthi Formulations, PMJ Jewelers, R3J Technologies, etc. We have been working on increasing employment sources for deaf students.

South Asia LPG Company Pvt Ltd

South Asia LPG Company Pvt Ltd, funded for DEF Skill Development Training Centre in Visakhapatnam. Centre is located Gurudwara, Visakhapatnam. The centre was inaugurated by SALPG Management Office in the month of June 2018. The centre equipped with Desktop PCs, furnitures and training materials with full support from SALP. The duration of the course is 2 to 3 months, the training includes English Conversational, Basic IT Skills, Typing Speed and General Skills.

DEF-VTP

The activities under the DEF VTP include courses such as General English, Quality Computer Education, Vocational, Practical Life Skill Training and Indian Sign Language, Placement services.

- ✓ The Foundation skills also include English, MS Office, and Soft Skills, DEO. The duration of the course is 4 or 6 months accordingly.
- ✓ The Indian Sign Language course is trained and charged on hourly basis.

Coaching Centre

Deaf students need additional help in their academics through Sign Language so they can understand and perform well in the courses they undertake. Keeping this in mind DEF started coaching classes for students exclusively in Indian Sign Language doing various courses like the Board of Intermediate Education and graduation courses (B. Com Computer Applications) from the Annamalai University. Our trainers are well trained and experienced who enable the students to complete their course curriculum well and perform better in their respective course.
