In the Indian Census of 2001, 1,261,722 persons were listed as hearing disabled among the totals of 21,906,769 populations of disabled in India. Another study states that more than 25,000 children are born deaf in India every year and eight-ten percent of the adult population has hearing problems.

The primary focus of the Deaf Enabled Foundation is "Preparing the Deaf to walk with the times". Our mission is to achieve equal access for Deaf people in every area of their lives. We are dedicated to work for the development of the Deaf community, enhancing the quality of live, providing educational facilities, promoting social and cultural awareness while working towards independence and barrier free communication for the Deaf. Vocational Training Program

Tech Mahindra Foundation Plus

Deaf Enabled Foundation and Tech Mahindra Foundation both are going hand in hand successfully from 3 years. We have been receiving tremendous response from deaf students from all over India. This course is offered for 2 months. We could see self-confidence and development in all the students after finishing 2 months of training. Today our students have been working with different companies like Ananth Technologies, Amaze Info Tech, Ducere, Deepthi Formulations, PMJ Jewelers, R3J Technologies, etc. We have been working on increasing employment sources for deaf students.

NSIC Training Project Vocational

Deaf Enabled Foundation had established three centres for computer training with the strong support by National Small Industries Corporation Limited at Puducherry, Thanjavur and Trichy. NSIC Corporate Social Responsibility has been supporting us financially for Recurring & Non-Recurring Expenses for above three centres. We have been receiving tremendous response from Deaf students as they have been benefited from this assistance. The course provided to deaf students is known as "Foundation Course" which consists of English structural grammatical course, Basic computer operating and life skills. The duration of this course is 45 days. This training is specially offered to underprivileged deaf students for BPL family. (Thanjavur, Puducherry, Trichy these centres have been continuously supported by National Small Industries Corporation Limited. It is only because of their support we could achieve this height. It was because of their faith in us we could start computer training centres in Puducherry, Thanjavur and Trichy)

DEF-VTP

The activities under the DEF- VTP include conducting courses such as General English, Quality Computer Education,

Vocationling, Placement Services, Practical Life Skill Training and Indian Sign Language.

- ✓ The Foundation skills included English, MS Office, and Soft Skills, DEO. The duration of the course is 6 or 4 months.
- ✓ The Indian Sign Language course is trained on the basis hour's package.

Coaching Centre

Deaf students need additional help in Sign Language so they can understand and perform well in the courses they undertake. Keeping this in mind DEF started Coaching Classes for students doing various courses from the Board of Intermediate Education for Higher Education students and the Annamalai University. A trained and experienced teacher enables these students to complete their course curriculum well and perform well in their respective courses.

Currently there are Deaf students from DEF doing Intermediate courses at the Senior Secondary level. DEF is also providing coaching to Deaf students pursuing B.Com in Computer Application from the Annamalai University and Andhra University through DEF's Coaching Classes.

Message from Founder & President

This year, Deaf Enabled Foundation celebrates 10 years as a Non-Government Organisation; 31st of October 2019 marked the 10th anniversary of our formal registration. Our Founder and President, TKM Sandeep, has taken a few moments to trace the tremendous progress made by the organization over the last 10 years:



"In some ways, it still feels like yesterday when we were first starting out – I can distinctly remember our first official day of operations. I'll never forget how different things were for the organisation back then -- Tiny office, low speed internet, manifold trips to the Xerox shop—I think you get the picture.

Fast forward to today and, whilst we remain a small team (our 'team' of 12 has become to 84 members), thankfully our everyday working lives are now a little easier! We finally have an office which is suitable for our ever expanding needs, technology allows us to communicate with our various centers via conference calls, black boards have become white, notes on paper have given place to hi-tech presentations on LED tv's and the internet! We have grown, we have progressed, we have adapted and moved with the changing times!

Currently DEF is running 10 skill development training centres in Hyderabad, Chennai, Vijayawada, Thanjavur, Puducherry, Visakhapatnam, Indore, Mumbai, Kolkata and Mahabubnagar. Yet, despite all the advancement, which has enabled us to become a much more effective and efficient organisation, our core values- of integrity, sincerity, efficiency and hard work-remain the same and true to our roots.

Besides our 10 centers, a major step forward has been the starting of the Talking Hands Restaurant (www.talkinghandsrestaurant.com), in Hyderabad in 2017 at Tourism Plaza, Greenlands, Begumpet. The restaurant is run and managed by Deaf Staff and where the customers communicate using basic Sign language. This restaurant serves as a unique employment opportunity for the deaf. 'Talking Hands' has 24 deaf employees and 11 hearing employees. We have a long term objective to build 'Talking Hands' as a brand that represents a unique dining experience, provides opportunity for employment and skill upgradation for deaf persons. Our dream is to employ deaf personnel in larger numbers, thus providing them with livelihood and opportunity for advancement in their careers.

Another major achievement has been the successful launch of the DEF-ISL App which is currently available on the Google Playstore and also via our YouTube channel. The App is a tremendous tool in furthering sign language education for the hearing as well as the deaf communities.

Of course, we have learnt an incredible amount, both through experience as well as through trialand-error since we started the training centres and institution upgrade project. Our expertise, experience, and the quality of our work is now recognised in Indian Sign language and respected not just in the deaf community but by those further afield as well.

We receive many requests for support and partnership from schools and local organisations

across the India – and we have a hard-earned reputation for delivering on our promises. As a major recognition of the work done by DEF, I was invited to the XVIII World Congress World Federation of the Deaf Annual Conference in July 2019 as a Plenary Presenter on the topic, 'Developing Skills and Improving Employability of Deaf Youth

-- Outlook and Challenges in India.'

We pride ourselves on pushing the envelope, continuing to raise the bar and set the standards, not just for our own projects but for other deaf community building associations and organisations too. Each new training centre development presents a fresh opportunity for learning, innovation and improvement and we are confident that the next training centre in Gujarat (which we will launch later this year) will once again help us reach new heights.

On the occasion of the 10th of Anniversary of the Deaf Enabled Foundation, we organised the DEF Decennial Games for the Deaf at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Chennai. More than 1400 of our deaf students, ex-students, trainers, ex as well as present staff were involved in organizing and participating in the 10 games and activities from 13th December to 15th December 2019. On the last Day, the Valedictory Ceremony and Awards Ceremony was graced by the Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu, Shri Banwarilal Purohit who presented the prestigious awards to the deserving candidates and partners.

To only communicate about our work on the ground is to overlook how the organization has advanced during the course of the last 10 years. The long period of 'hand-to-mouth' existence is fortunately behind us and while we remain indebted to the valuable support our early donors and supporters who are still with us since the beginning, we are thankful to be in a position now with a more sustainable income stream and a solid reputation and profile based on our past performance. That we are in this position is demonstration of incredibly difficult work put in by every member of our team throughout the years and additionally bears testimony to the faith and confidence an expanding number of individuals and associations have in the abilities of the deaf. It is a trust that we have endeavoured to build up and one that we realize we need to work consistently to retain! As I draw this snapshot of reflection, I think back over the 10 years with a tremendous feeling of pride at the progress of our foundation and with appreciation for every one of the individuals and associations who have helped us along the way. However, more than anything, I look to the future with a certainty that the greatest years are still ahead of us!"
